- o 4th Annual National Night Out Tues, 8/6, 6-8pm

NPO Mike Badger

- o Introduced Lt. Dodd, who is in charge of street officers.
- Talked about motorized bikes and 4-wheelers, which are becoming a problem in St.
 Louis
- Funnel reports of drug dealers through NPO.
- o Handout for residents to register their video cameras:
 - In case of nearby crime, police may ask for footage from your camera; they are not automatically hooked up to the city.
- o Lock it or lose it
- o Project Safe Horizon for addicts not arrested but provided treatment at Gateway.
- o Cops & Bobbers at Southwind Park, 5-13 years old
- o Jr Police Academy 5-13 year old.
- Mobile cameras (Horace Mann) for hot spots; some hidden cameras used for drug houses.
- o Dozens of meth houses in Springfield; 10,000 users.
- Coffee with a Cop Hardees Sangamon Ave 2 more this year.

Juan Huerta, Director of Community Relations

- Handles housing, discrimination in housing, landlord / tenant issues, explains rules.
- o Mayor pushes for customer service nearly 100 calls a month.
- Most of their clients are tenants; help find housing / Section 8
- Rules for eviction:
 - 5 days for non-payment
 - 10 days behavior against lease
 - 20 days month-to-month
- o They partner with police, Land of Lincoln Legal, Sangamon County Attorney's Office
- o Field complaints against police and send to department of internal affairs.

- Works with ADA on accessibility.
- Youth programs 40-60 for basketball workshops
- Americorp 3 year grant serves 60 kids to mentor or help; employs adults money for college.
- o Homeless -
 - Goals: low barrier shelter with services; permanent housing
 - Winter Warming Center
 - Lowes helped fix up
 - Police help a lot
 - Allows everyone except sex offenders.
 - Sign up every night something to eat
 - Helping Hands helps to manage
 - November 1 to March 21.
 - No cooling center in summer, but a list of 15-20 locations where they can get cool
 - Having many homeless at library and church on 7th St is not a solution; need a solution: Low Barrier Shelter to have a location all year with services.
 - Chris Jones is the HOT Officer
 - Providing homeless services attracts more homeless from other cities; other cities give homeless bus tickets to Springfield.

Panhandlers

- Makes city look bad. Can't be in roadway.
- 80% of money given to them goes to drugs and alcohol; DOES NOT help it
 HURTS and prevents them from getting treatment. They are going to stand on
 corners as long as they keep getting money.

o Landlords

- 3-4 same landlords; big apartments
- Many questions about rental rules:
 - Lease should specify number of people; if you think there are too many, call the landlord and let them know.
- Landlord training in the fall at South Side Christian Church: Sheriff, Sentinel (bedbugs) present, Springfield Housing Authority, Land of Lincoln Legal presentations
- Handed out Landlord booklet
